Do YOU Need Help???

Do you have a family member who is in need of help such as respite, personal care, or assistive technology? If so, you need to find out more about Medicaid Waivers! Below will get you started!

You don't know what you can get until you ask!!

It's important to find out, since many waivers have waiting lists. Virginia's Medicaid Waivers allows Medicaid to pay for a wide variety of services for people of all ages who have disabilities so that they may remain in their homes and communities with the supports they need rather than having to receive services in a nursing home or large facility. Don't worry the financial Medicaid requirements are based on the individual's income not the family's income!

These are some of the available waivers:

Elderly or Disabled with Consumer Direction (EDCD); HIV / AIDS; Alzheimer's Assisted Living (AAL); Technology Assisted (Tech); Day Support HCBW for Persons with MR; Individual and Family DD Support (IFDDS); Intellectual Disability (ID)

Your child comes home complaining of problems in the classroom. Or, if your child has an IEP, schoolwork is different than you expected. Who are you going to call??

The "chain of command" needs to be followed.

<u>You can call the Parent Resource Center at any time for options too.</u>

*Talk to your child.

*Speak to your child's teacher.

*Still not resolved, the guidance counselor could be next.

*Then the child's principal or assistant principal.

If the problem still persists, talk to the supervisor at the Central Office in charge of the program or area of concern.

Advisory Committee. Every school division is required to have a SEAC as detailed in Regulations Governing Special Education Programs for Children with Disabilities in Virginia, effective January 25, 2010 (special education regulations). The major purpose of SEACs is to provide an opportunity for parents and other school board appointees to have a voice in the way school divisions provide services to students with disabilities. SEACs are extensions of local school boards since members are appointed by them, and SEACs provide reports and recommendations to their school
